A hearing is scheduled in circuit court at 1:30 p.m. today for six homes the city of Port St. Lucie is seeking to gain through forfeiture as part of its marijuana grow house investigation.

State law allows cash, vehicles, real estate and other property to be seized if it can be proven they were used in the commission of a felony or were gained through criminal proceeds. The hearing Monday will be to determine if there is probable cause for the city to seize the houses.

If probable cause if found, the homeowners are allowed to have jury trials to determine if the city should be able to seize their properties. The forfeiture proceedings are a civil matter separate from any criminal charges that are pending.
