## School Board to appeal ruling on impact fee

DeLand -- The Volusia County School Board on Tuesday voted to keep fighting opponents of a new $\$ 5,284$ impact fee for schools.


The School Board unanimously agreed to appeal a ruling earlier this month by Florida Administrative Law Judge Don W. Davis, who sided with the Volusia Home Builders Association, foes of the new fee.

Home builders said the fee, which jumped from $\$ 1,139$ to $\$ 5,284$ on June 6 at the request of the School Board to help pay for growth, was procedurally flawed.

When School Board members selected a fee proposed by their consultant in January, they effectively created a "rule" under Florida law without following the mandatory steps under the state's Administrative Procedure Act, Davis said in his ruling.

Not so, School Board members said Tuesday.
The consultant only provided information and the School Board acted legally, Chairwoman Candace Lankford said.
