Stakeholders Advisory Group's first meeting set for Friday

The first meeting of a new advisory group to the county commission is set for Friday.

The Stakeholders Advisory Group (SAG) is a collection of 28 commission-appointed representatives from a wide array of stakeholder groups and organizations.

SAG's purpose is to review and provide input to the commission on issues such as potential rule adoptions or amendments, impact fee and other funding studies, procedures and policies of county programs, and the value of and need for current or proposed programs and services.

The county commission recently created the group to get more public input on county issues.

SAG will have no rule-making or amendment authority, but will include its input in the back-up materials for commission agendas. When SAG members can't reach consensus on an issue, the opposing points of view can be submitted to the commission.

SAG meetings and any subcommittees created will operate under the Sunshine Law. Because SAG serves in an advisory capacity only, there is no quorum threshold for meetings. The public is invited to attend and comment.

The first meeting will get a Sunshine Law presentation, and members will then elect a chair and vice-chair. Topics/categories for review could include: Impact Fee Update, Land Development Code Revision, Ordinance Amendments, County Mission Statement, County Vision, Citizen's Academy and other issues.

The first meeting will be at 2 p.m. in Room 166 at the Lecanto Government Building.
