HBA thanks City of Rogersville for impact fee reduction

- The Chief Executive Officer of the Home Builders Association of Greater Springfield expressed gratitude for the city for temporarily reducing its impact fees by 75 percent.
- "I know the home builders are very grateful for the reduction on the impact fees," said Matt Morrow, at Monday's meeting of the Rogersville Board of Aldermen.
- The reduction was approved Monday, Feb. 6, after the city received a letter from the HBA. Impact fees are associated with adding water and sewer lines to a new building in the city limits.
- The city saw an increase of building permits since it decided to reduce the impact fees, according to city building inspector Eddie Castleberry.
- At Monday's meeting the board decided to extend the reduction through January to give more builders the opportunity to take advantage of the lower prices.
- Morrow spoke about a new site established by the HBA called lookB4Ubuild. The site compares the cost of building fees, including impact fees and building permit fees, in various local cities.
- "Right now, the city of Rogersville looks very favorable because of the decision made to reduce the impact fees," Morrow said.
- According to the site, Rogersville's total building fees cost about \$1,175. Compared to other Webster County and Greene County cities, Rogersville's fees are lower than some and higher than others.
- Marshfield's fees come in lower than Rogersville at \$1,130, whereas building fees in Republic are priced higher than Rogersville at \$1,921, according to the site.
- Morrow said the HBA has not seen a large turnaround in building, but it has seen a little growth, and having cities like Rogersville help to reduce fees can help to increase the amount of home building.
