The Jefferson County Courtroom was filled as residents came out to tell their elected commissioners this is no time for impact fees.

Impact fees in Jefferson County were put into place in June of 2008, costing hose looking to build a \square home over \$3,000 dollars.

"Just not a good time. A small county that we are. We need economic development. We don't need barriers to economic growth," says concerned resident Paul Michael.

The Board of County Commissioners say they will hold a workshop on January 29th, to brainstorm solutions.
