FERNLEY — A mortgage lender, casino owner, concrete construction business owner and a mechanical engineer were chosen to serve as "at-large members" of the City of Fernley's Capital Improvement Committee (CIC).

The Fernley City Council voted at its meeting last Wednesday to approve Tica Looper, Curtis Loper, Ray Lowrey and Michael Vegas to join Fernley Planning Commissioners Bill Clegg, Bert McCoy and Bob Smith on the CIC.

The first meeting of the CIC will be held on Feb. 22.

At its Dec. 7, 2005 meeting, the Council voted to direct Community Development Director Pete Wysocki to establish a seven-person committee, of which three would be members of the Fernley Planning Commission.

The Planning Commission selected its three members at its Dec. 11 meeting.
